**SECOND COLLECTION** Next week our diocese will take up the Peter's Pence Collection, which provides the Holy Father with the assistance he needs to carry out his most important charitable works. **YOU MAY HAVE NOTICED** that we are now using new gold-clad metal Communion vessels, in line with recent Church requirements that these be unbreakable. The *General Instruction on the Roman Missal* states "Sacred vessels are to be made from precious metal.... In the Dioceses of the United States of America, sacred vessels may also be made from other solid materials that, according to the common estimation in each region, are precious, for example, ebony or other hard woods, provided that such materials are suited to sacred use and do not easily break or deteriorate." (GIRM 328, 329). The new bowls have been donated by a generous parishioner. If anyone would like to contribute toward new communion cups or other needs, please contact Fr. Kevin.

**Corpus Christi**

Next week we will celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi, now called the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, which was developed during the Middle Ages (in the year 1264) at the request of **St. Thomas Aquinas**. He wrote the hymns and prayers for the feast. Its purpose was to emphasize the presence of **Jesus** in the Eucharist.

A procession with the Blessed Sacrament in a monstrance was a public display of faith. Processions, incense, flowers, canopy, monstrance! For 800 years people looked at and adored our Lord in the Eucharist, singing about the awesome presence of Christ among us, remembering Holy Thursday, spiritually communing but rarely daring to receive the Body and Blood of the Lord in Holy Communion. Today we understand once more that the Eucharist is for eating and drinking.

Next week, at the end of the 10:30 Mass we will have a small Corpus Christi procession around our parking lot here at OLPH, followed by Benediction on the church steps.

The feast of the Body and Blood of Christ calls us to ponder the love of our savior who came to be with us and to serve us in a most ordinary way, and to ask how we might follow more closely in his footsteps.



**Stewardship** of all that **God** has given us extends far beyond just giving time and money to the Church & charity.

Think of all the ways that you are a good steward beyond giving money and time. The time you give to being a good parent, the participation in your local community, staying healthy (like exercising, getting a flu shot, or eating right), etc.

Help your children to see the things you do (taking care of the environment, giving to charity, helping out your neighbors or family) as good stewardship.

Remember that reading good books, praying regularly, being good to your friends, eating healthy food, are all ways of being a good steward.
